A Message From Your Supervisor of Elections:

As your Supervisor of Elections, my focus is simple, making sure every eligible voter has access to accurate information, a smooth voting experience, and confidence in how elections are conducted. Voting is both a right and a responsibility, and it starts with being prepared.

One of the most important things you can do is keep your voter registration up to date. If you've moved, changed your name, updated your Florida Driver's License or State ID, or want to update your party affiliation, take a few minutes to make those updates. Accurate information ensures you receive the correct ballot, are assigned to the right precinct, and helps avoid delays on Election Day.

For those considering running for office, it's critical to understand the qualifying requirements and deadlines. These deadlines are set in law and cannot be extended. Candidates should review all requirements carefully and submit all documentation within the qualifying period.

Polling locations can change from election to election. Before you vote, confirm your assigned precinct and polling place, or explore early voting and vote-by-mail options to find what works best for you. Being prepared ahead of time helps ensure a quick and efficient experience.

Elections work best when everyone does their part. Keeping your information current, knowing key deadlines, and understanding the process all contribute to elections that are run accurately, securely, and efficiently.

The 2026 elections are fast approaching. Stay informed and plan ahead by adding these important election dates and deadlines to your calendar now.

2026 FLORIDA PRIMARY ELECTION

- **ELECTION DAY: TUESDAY, AUGUST 18, 2026**
- Voter Registration and Party Affiliation Change Deadline: JULY 20, 2026
- VOTE-BY-MAIL Request Deadline: AUGUST 6, 2026
- EARLY VOTING: August 8-August 15, 10 am-6 pm

2026 GENERAL ELECTION

- **ELECTION DAY: TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3, 2026**
- Voter Registration Deadline: OCTOBER 5, 2026
- VOTE-BY-MAIL Request Deadline: OCTOBER 22, 2026
- EARLY VOTING: October 19-November 1, 7 am-7 pm

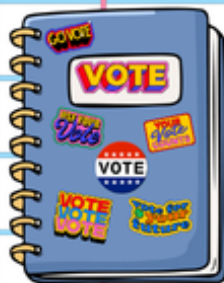
Seminole Elections Office Partners with Lake Mary High School to Deliver Taxpayer Savings

We are sending Vote-by-Mail Expiration Notices to voters who voted by mail in the 2024 election and have not yet renewed their request. This notice is to remind you that your **Vote-by-Mail ballot request must be renewed** to remain active for

future elections. If you receive a notice, please follow the instructions provided or visit our website to check your status and renew your Vote-By-Mail request for the 2026 election cycle.

We have also completed mailing Address Change Notices as part of our ongoing effort to keep voter records accurate. If you've moved, please take a moment to review and update your information online.

ANY REGISTERED VOTER MAY REQUEST A VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT.

When requested, we mail your ballot to wherever you will be, and you can take your time making your voting decisions.

RETURN IT

Mail your Vote-by-Mail ballot at least 7 days before Election Day or drop it off at a secure designated drop-off location. Visit VoteSeminole.gov to see where and when.

HB 991 Update:

House Bill 991 has been signed into law. What's most important right now is that this year's election will be business as usual for voters for the 2026 Election Cycle.

Provisions affecting voters will not take effect until **January 1, 2027**.
