**Canvassing Board Members:** County Judge Carsandra Buie (Chair), Seminole County BOCC Chairman Andria Herr, County Judge James DeKleva (Alternative Member), County Commissioner Lee Constantine (Alternative Member) and Supervisor of Elections Amy Pennock.

Following the conclusion of the public testing of the voting equipment and automated independent audit system, the Canvassing Board shall commence Vote-By-Mail (VBM) ballot opening and processing. This will continue daily, as needed, until completion. VBM, early voting, and election day ballots will be scanned into the automated independent audit system daily, as needed, until completion. No results will be released until after the polls close on August 18, 2026 (F.S. 101.5614). Should it be necessary to amend this schedule, a notice will be posted at [VoteSeminole.gov](http://VoteSeminole.gov).

If any elector or candidate present believes that a VBM ballot is illegal due to a defect apparent on the voter's certificate or cure affidavit, he or she may, at any time before the ballot is removed from the envelope, file with the Canvassing Board a protest against the canvass of that ballot, specifying the precinct, the voter's certificate or the cure affidavit, and the reason he or she believes the ballot to be illegal. Unopened ballots will be available for public inspection half an hour before each opening. Please email [elections@voteseminole.gov](mailto:elections@voteseminole.gov) if you want further information about daily vote-by-mail opening dates and times.

Pursuant to F.S. 101.572(2), the Supervisor of Elections will provide reasonable access to ballot materials for inspection by a candidate, political party official, political committee official, or an authorized designee thereof, before canvassing or tabulation.
