Resident Sign – Up Sheet Due - (Per statute, names must be submitted no later than 28 days prior to Election Day.)

***Completed sheets must be returned to our office by the sign-up deadline. ***

To collect completed voter registration applications from residents (other than family members), your facility must register as a Third-Party Voter Registration Organization (3PVRO) with the Florida Division of Elections — dos.myflorida.com/elections/.

Section 2 | How To Participate & Program Guidelines

Step – By – Step Process for Facilities

1. **Ensure residents are registered to vote-by-mail.** Only residents already on file with a vote-by-mail request will receive a ballot on our visit.

Residents can request a Vote-By-Mail Ballot at VoteSeminole.gov, by phone at 407-585-8683.

2. **Complete the Facility Request Form** (page 5) and return it at least **28 days** prior to the election — by **July 21 (Primary)** or **October 6 (General)**. Email: Outreach@voteseminole.gov, Fax to 407-708-7705 or mail to P.O. Box 1479, Sanford, FL 32772.

3. **Collect the Resident Sign-Up Sheet** (page 6) — have each participating resident provide their date of birth, full legal name, and signature, and indicate if they need voting assistance. **Return with your Facility Request Form.**

4. **We confirm your appointment.** Your request is not final until you receive our office's written confirmation with the scheduled date and time.

5. **On the scheduled date**, please assemble residents in a common area. Our two-person nonpartisan team will bring ballots and assist any resident who needs help marking or reading their ballot. We will allot a 2-hour window for this program.

Program Guidelines – F.S. §101.655

1	The facility must submit a written request no later than 28 days prior to the election, including the facility name, address, and names of all electors who wish to participate. If fewer than five voters are listed, the Supervisor is not required to provide supervised voting.
2	Our goal is to make one visit per election . Please coordinate with your residents in advance and select a date and time that works for everyone before returning the sign-up form.
3	Residents must be registered to vote-by-mail before our visit — our team can only deliver a ballot to voters already on file. Our team cannot register new voters or process new VBM requests on the day of the visit. Contact our office in advance if residents need to sign up for vote-by-mail.
4	No candidates or political party representatives may be present at your facility during supervised voting. We do not release appointment schedules to protect voter privacy.
5	Residents vote on a paper ballot sealed in an envelope . The envelope signature must match the signature on file. If a resident's signature has changed, they can submit a new voter registration application (Form DS-DE 39) to our office — SOE office has to have signature update BEFORE receiving mail ballot . We recommend doing this well before the supervised voting visit to ensure the envelope signature matches.
6	If a resident has a unique situation — such as waiting for a family member to assist — please let us know in advance and we will work to accommodate them.
7	Once your appointment is confirmed, please give us as much advance notice as possible if circumstances change. We are happy to handle unforeseen situations.

VOTE-BY-MAIL & VOTER REGISTRATION

Any Seminole County registered voter may request a vote-by-mail ballot by 5:00 p.m. on the 12th day before Election Day —online at VoteSeminole.gov, by phone at **407-585-8683**, or via the attached form. To schedule a Voter Education event at your facility, contact our office.

Section 3 | Supervised Voting Facility Request Form

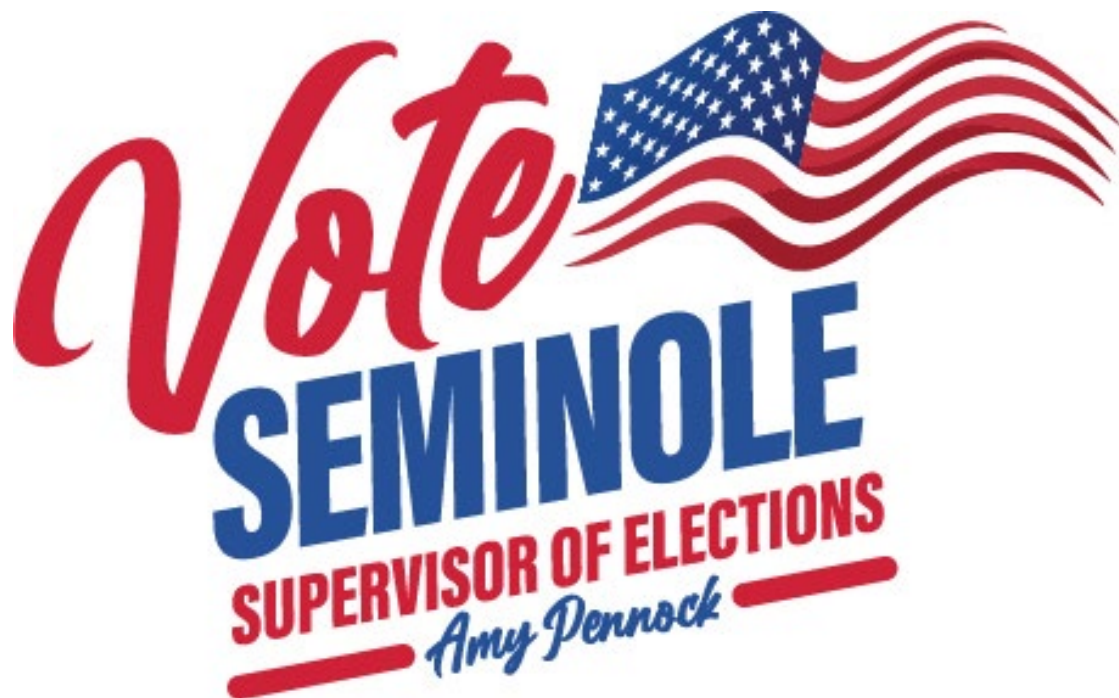

Vote-By-Mail	Request by August 6 (Primary) or October 22 (General) at 5:00 p.m. Call 407-585-8683 or visit VoteSeminole.gov .
Early Voting	Primary: Aug 8–15, 10 am–6 pm General: Oct 19–Nov 1, 7 am–7 pm. Check VoteSeminole.gov for all Seminole County locations.
Election Day	Primary: Aug 18 General: Nov 3. Vote at your assigned precinct. Paper ballots used in all Seminole County elections. Check VoteSeminole.gov for your Election Day polling location.
